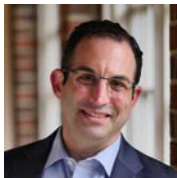

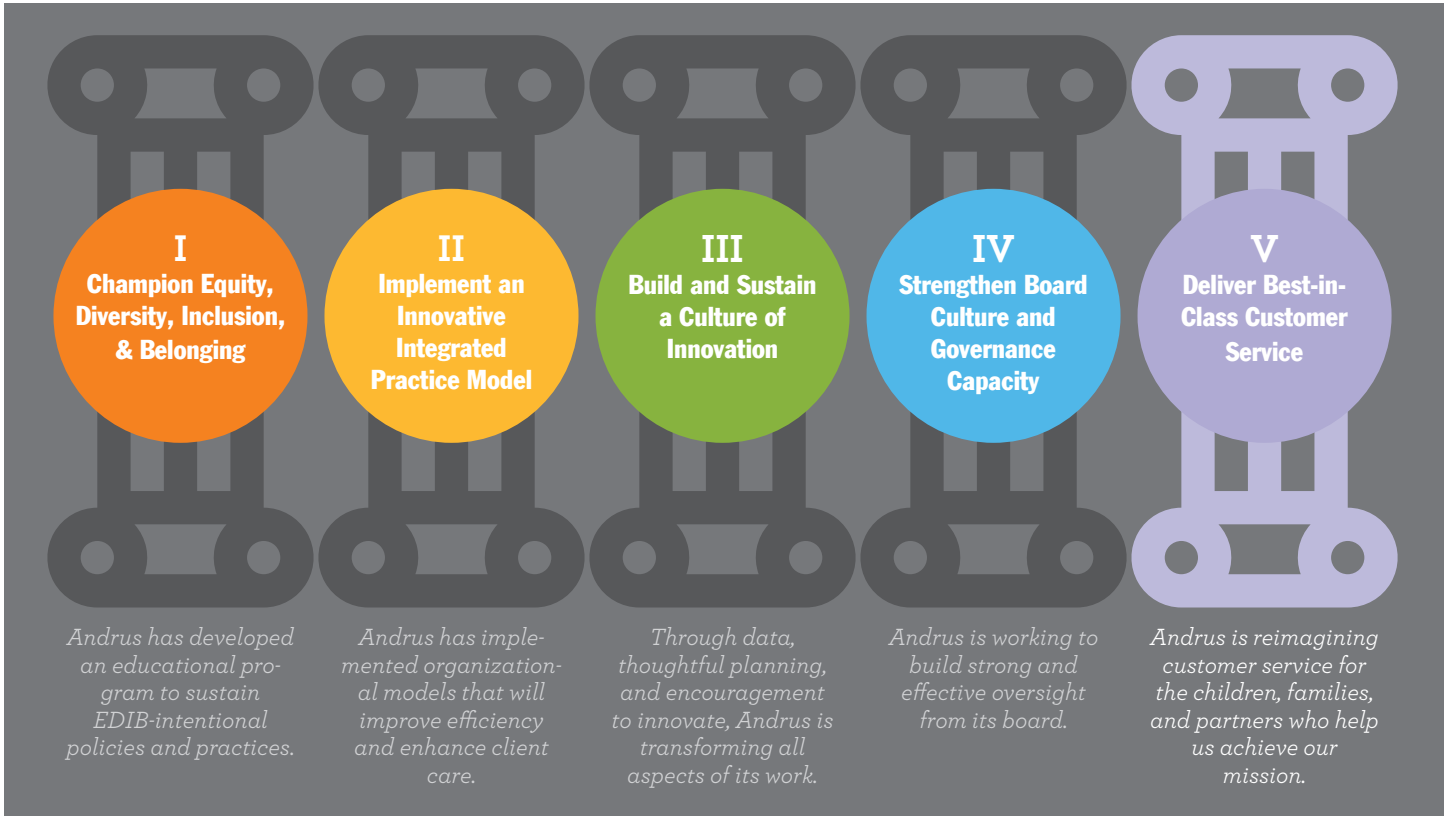
A Message From Our President & CEO Heath Bloch

The children were honored with the task of voting for a name, and the winner by 22 votes: *Oreo!*

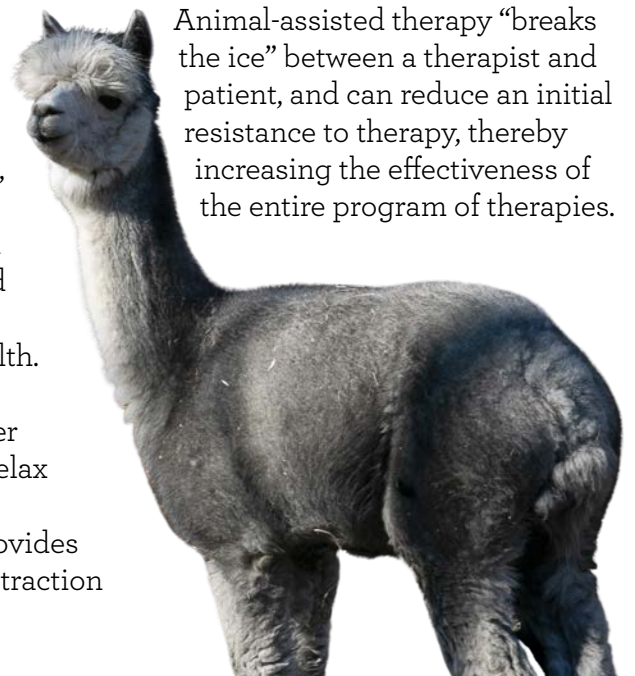
Animal-Assisted Therapy

Animal-assisted therapy is an important element of the therapy program at Andrus. It provides significant mental health benefits to the residential and day school students in our care. Interacting with an animal prompts the body to release serotonin, prolactin and oxytocin, hormones that have been shown to lower stress and depression, helping to support good mental health.

The release of these hormones also helps lower anxiety, so children will relax during their therapy. The presence of an animal provides comfort and a needed distraction

from an otherwise challenging time.

Some children have mental health blocks that make therapy and treatment more difficult. Animal-assisted therapy “breaks the ice” between a therapist and patient, and can reduce an initial resistance to therapy, thereby increasing the effectiveness of the entire program of therapies.



Summer Camp Fun

Our new Therapeutic Recreation Director, Michelle Yadon, and her team organized a fun-filled, action-packed summer, providing a nice break for Andrus residential students. Activities included cookouts, a scavenger hunt at Untermeyer Gardens, the ropes course, visits to Dave & Buster's and Applebee's, field games, and arts and crafts.

The staff and our CEO, Heath Bloch, joined the children in a rousing game of Andrus "fun ball," a more relaxed version of dodge ball. The two teams gave it their all, but one team dominated, winning three out of three games.
